CONCEPT & FORMAT

TRAINING BACKGROUND & PURPOSE

English Medium Instruction (EMI) has become a crucial component of higher education in non-Anglophone countries as universities strive to internationalize their curricula, attract international students, and equip local students with the skills necessary for the global job market. As EMI expands across disciplines, content lecturers face challenges in delivering their courses in English while maintaining student engagement and ensuring effective learning. This training program is designed to support faculty members at the National University of Mongolia (NUM) in adopting interactive and student-centered approaches to EMI. This two and a half hour session, organized in collaboration with the CAMCA Academy and CAMCA Academic Consortium, will introduce practical strategies for enhancing interactivity and engagement in EMI classrooms. It will focus on improving content delivery, fostering student participation, and optimizing communication in Englishmedium courses.

By the end of the training, participants will be able to:

- Understand key principles of interactive EMI pedagogy.
- Apply practical strategies for making content delivery clearer and more engaging.
- Utilize interactive teaching techniques that foster student participation.

4. Enhancing Student Engagement in EMI Courses

- Motivating students in EMI settings
- Scaffolding and supporting student comprehension
- Feedback strategies for improved learning outcomes

5. Open Discussion and Q&A

- Sharing experiences and challenges
- Best practices from various disciplines

Dr. Murad Ismailov is an Associate Professor at the Institute of Humanities and Social Sciences, University of Tsukuba, one of Japan's top ten universities designated by the Ministry of Education, Culture, Sports, Science, and Technology (MEXT). He is also an Adjunct Professor at the Tokyo University of Foreign Studies. Dr. Ismailov is a Director of the Campus-wide EMI Faculty Training Program and Head of the EMI and Internationalization Research Group at the University of Tsukuba. He is also the Founding President of the CAMCA Academy and CAMCA Academic Consortium, initiatives that foster academic collaboration across Central Asia, Mongolia, the Caucasus, and Afghanistan (CAMCA) region. His research focuses on EMI pedagogy, internationalization, educational technology, and global higher education policies.
